

BY-LAW #09/16

OF THE

RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF ROCKWOOD

Being a By-law of the Rural Municipality of Rockwood to set reduced-speed school zone within the municipality.

WHEREAS Section 98.1 of the Highway Traffic Act and the Reduced-Speed School Zones Regulation No. 136/2013 authorize a council to pass by-laws establishing the reduced maximum permitted speed for vehicles being driven on a highway within a school zone within the geographic boundaries of a municipality; and

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Rural Municipality of Rockwood deems it advisable and in the best interests of the Municipality to establish school zones with a reduced maximum speed for vehicles;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Rural Municipality of Rockwood enacts as a By-Law the following:

1. Interpretation

- 1.1 The By-Law may be called the "Reduced-Speed School Zone By-Law";
- 1.2 For the purpose of the By-Law, "highway", "reduced-speed school zone", "school", "school property", "traffic control device", and "vehicle" have the same meanings as set out in the Highway Traffic Act and the Reduced-Speed School Zones Regulation No. 136/2013.

2. Establishment of reduced-speed school zone

- 2.1 The following portion of the municipal road is designated as reduced-speed school zone with reduced maximum permitted speed:
 - a. **Name of School:** Stony Mountain Elementary School

Highway included in the reduced-speed school zone:
 - i. *That portion of School Road beginning at the point where the Stony Mountain Day Care (located in the Stony Mountain Curling Club facility) and continues east ending at Maple Drive (ending at the Stony Mountain School property).*

3. Maximum permitted speed within reduced-speed school zones

The maximum permitted speed for vehicles being driven in a reduced-speed school zone on a highway is:

- a. 30 km/h
- b. 50 km/h if the maximum permitted speed for that portion of municipal road within the reduced-speed school zone is 80 km/h or more.


4. Times when the reduced-speed school zones apply

The reduced maximum permitted speed established under section 3 apply only from September 1 to June 30, between 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and between Monday to Friday within a reduced-speed school zone.


5. *Traffic control devices*

The municipality shall identify a reduced-speed school zone with traffic control devices that comply with the Reduced-Speed School Zones Regulation No. 136/2013.
